




The CSGSA serves as a **central forum of representation** for graduate students.


Transportation Options

- N line (N for Nederland)



 - Stops along the major suburbs on the way
 - $x \in \{1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6\}$ have same general route, different start/end points

Airport




- AB1/AB2 routes go straight from Boulder to DIA
- A-line train goes from downtown Denver to DIA
- Covered by RTD pass!
 - ~1h15 trip for the whole line
- 30–45-minute drive



